For students who began their programs in 1974 or later, computer generated academic records replaced those issued earlier. Where a student first enrolled prior to 1974, the entry "credit gained before 1974" indicates a full academic record is shown in two separate statements. From 1990 the Queensland Agricultural College (QAC) became The University of Queensland Gatton College and is now designated University of Queensland, Gatton. Students enrolled at QAC prior to 1990 who then enrolled at the University will have a separate statement for their pre-1990 studies.

The Academic Year

For most programs, the academic year is from March until November and is divided into two semesters each of 13 weeks duration. From 1990, courses have been offered from November to February in a Summer Semester.

Notings

A Dean's Commendation is awarded to students who achieve a minimum grade point average of 6, based on a full time equivalent load on a semester basis (or an annual basis in the case of year long courses).

Honours²

Honours are awarded in one of three classes: honours class I; honours class II (A or B); honours class III. From Semester 2, 2005, the use of weighted percentage scores to calculate the class of honours, using University-wide cutoff scores, will be introduced progressively across all honours programs.
