# Eastern Mennonite University Transcript Key

## I. INSTITUTIONAL TITLE

Eastern Mennonite College and Seminary became Eastern Mennonite University as of August 22, 1994.

## II. ACCREDITATIONS

Eastern Mennonite University is accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools to award associate, baccalaureate, and masters degrees. The university is certified to operate by the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia.

Eastern Mennonite Seminary, a graduate division of EMU, received accreditation from the Association of Theological Schools in 1986.

The nursing program was accredited by the Virginia State Board of Nursing in August 1970 and the National League for Nursing in December 1970.

The teacher education program was accredited by the National Council for the Accreditation of Teacher Education in September 1971.

The social work program, which prepares students for beginning social work practice, received accreditation from the Council on Social Work Education in November 1976, retroactive to July 1975.

The dietetics program was accredited in August 1974 by the American Dietetics Association. The program was discontinued as of summer 1994.

The Graduate Counseling Program was accredited by the Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related Education Programs in March 2002.

## III. CREDIT UNIT AND CALENDAR

The semester hour is used to designate credit earned. A full-time load is defined as 12-18 semester hours in the undergraduate division. Seminary and graduate programs define full-time status as a minimum of 9

semester hours. The traditional academic year consists of two fifteen-week semesters offered September through April. Summer courses are offered through a variety of calendar options. The calendar for the Adult Degree Completion Program consists of two consecutive terms of approximately 30 weeks each, which may begin at various points during the calendar year. Graduate programs may follow non-traditional terms with courses beginning and ending at various points.

## IV. COURSE NUMBERS AND GRADING SYSTEM

Courses numbered 100-299 are lower-level undergraduate; 300-499 are upper-level undergraduate; 500-799 are seminary/graduate level. For the undergraduate division, course numbers which differ only in their last digit indicate the same course taken in different semesters.

## V. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION (UNDERGRADUATE DIVISION)

1. A variety of cross-cultural study experiences have been offered since 1983-84. Courses frequently include humanities, religion or social science content and are identified by department headings of CC \_\_\_\_\_.

Content breakdown for individual cross-cultural courses may be obtained from the University Registrar's Office.

2. Degree requirements for students entering the undergraduate program September 1983 through January 1991 included demonstration of mathematics competency as defined in the 1983-1991 undergraduate catalogs.

3. Nursing courses carrying a Pass grade indicate advanced placement based on prior learning which meets part or all of the course requirements.

4. Prior to fall 1995, grades for transfer courses were applied toward the EMU grade point average. This policy continues in effect for students enrolled through the Adult Degree Completion Program. As of fall 1995, transfer grades for students in other programs are not applied toward the EMU grade average unless the credit was taken at another institution under EMU sponsorship.

5. An Adult Degree Completion Program was initiated in the spring of 1995. This accelerated program allows adult students to complete a major in Management and Organizational Development or Nursing in approximately 15 months. Additional credit may be earned through preparation of a portfolio formally documenting professional training and life-learning experiences. The portfolio is submitted to EMU faculty for evaluation and the awarding of credit.

6. EMU began offering degree programs at a site in Lancaster, Pennsylvania, in the fall of 1997.

## VI. ADDITIONAL TRANSCRIPT INFORMATION

1. Transfer credit grades are shown in EMU equivalents.

2. Transferred credits are shown in semester hours.

3. Transcripts issued for students enrolled since September 1988 are computer-printed; older transcripts are photocopies of paper records. The transcript format was changed significantly as of August 1994.
