I have worked with government institutions, private and development sectors in international and multicultural settings in Kenya, Tanzania, and the U.A.E. My specific skills include but are not limited to the following:

# 1. Intervention design and Implementation:

- Intervention scoping of status quo of commercial forestry, Commercial forestry contractor services, local and international seed sources
- At Gatsby Africa's Kenya Commercial Forestry programme (KCFP), successfully developed a threepillar intervention design leading to Kenya Commercial Tree Improvement Strategy (KCTIS) endorsed by Sector actors. Currently leading the amendment of three seed regulations which will enable commercial forestry growers of all sizes to access improved germplasm for the sector.
- Developed a feasible intervention design that includes results chain, concept notes, recourse allocation, risk analysis, and implementation framework for Gatsby Africa's Cotton and Textile Development Programme in the Lake zone of Tanzania. This led to the establishment of a network of 350 village-based agro-dealers. At the implementation phase, I also managed contracts and donor funds.

# 2. Stakeholder management: Influencing, grant management, technical assistance:

- At Gatsby Africa's **Kenya Commercial Forestry Programme (KCFP)**, Successfully co-created with Kenya Forestry Research Institute (KEFRI) grant agreement funded by Gatsby Africa.
- Led and influenced validation of market-driven Kenya Commercial Tree Improvement Strategy (KCTIS).
- Successfully influenced National Environment Authority (NEMA), to extend the ban on plastic potting materials for one year to allow identification of alternative potting materials.
